About Children's Place

MISSION: Building a secure and hopeful today so children facing health issues and poverty succeed tomorrow.

History

Children's Place Association has been partnering with local communities since **1991** to create a brighter future for Chicago's most vulnerable children. We've been tackling health disparities, poverty, and racial injustice, providing stability for children and empowering families for a promising tomorrow. On **April 10, 1989**, Children's Place Association opened. Although we have made significant progress over the years, there remains an urgent need to ensure children facing health inequities and violence feel safe and have access to vital support services for their success. We are thrilled to have you join us in this important work!

Our Programs

- **Child Thrive:** Empowering Children's Success. Our Resource Center offers vital support for children's growth and well-being, including youth mentoring, trauma-informed mental health services, primary care access, enriching after-school programs, and dynamic summer mini-camps. Together, we nurture their potential for a brighter future. (Volunteers needed afternoon, early evenings).
- Early Education Programs: Igniting a Lifetime of Learning. Our Early Learning Center and Home-based education programs are dedicated to serving low-income children, aged six weeks to five years old, whose families face unique health conditions or disabilities. With a focus on individualized care, our programs provide on-site health services and specialized curriculum tailored to the specific needs of each child. Through nurturing environments and personalized attention, we lay the foundation for a lifelong love of learning, ensuring every child reaches their full potential. (Volunteers needed weekdays).
- Adoption & Foster Care: We specialize in pairing children with trained foster parents who meet their unique needs. At Children's Place, we also facilitate adoptions for children unable to reunite with their birth families. Many of our foster children have special medical and behavioral needs. (Volunteers rarely needed).
- Child Support & Family Services: Our holistic approach empowers families to overcome life's challenges, providing essential strategies, skills, and support for a thriving future. We assist families dealing with health issues, trauma, and financial hardships, offering secure housing, summer camps, financial counseling, mental health support, and comprehensive case management. Together, we lay the groundwork for healthy, successful lives. (Volunteers as needed).
- International: Illuminating Futures for Vulnerable Children. Children's Place International partners with organizations in developing nations to brighten the lives of children facing illness and extreme poverty. Our mission is to uplift the world's most vulnerable by improving access to essential healthcare, nutrition, and education, while fostering local capacity building. Together, we empower communities, instill hope, and create lasting global impact.

Annual Drives

Throughout the year, we have several opportunities to support our community through clothing drives, back-to-school supplies, and bringing holiday cheer. Look at the different options below:

Adopt A Family:

During the holiday season, our Adopt a Family program helps create a joyous celebration for our families. You can choose to adopt a family, assist with gift sorting, or contribute in both ways. Your participation is invaluable in making this program a success. We begin in October to be prepared for delivery in mid-December.

Back to School Supplies:

In late summer, we host a drive to gather essential supplies for our kids as they head back to school. This drive takes place in late July into August.

Clothing Drive:

Help us collect adult and children's clothing to provide to our community in need. This drive takes place in January or February.

Hygiene Product Drive:

Help us gather hygiene products as the hot summer months approach to provide to our community in need. This drive takes place in late spring.

Volunteer Requirements

Volunteer Training & Procedures:

- Regular Volunteers (more than once a quarter): Must complete training, orientation, and submit required paperwork, including a DCFS background check and medical data. Volunteers must always be with regularly scheduled staff members. Before starting full onboarding, you'll complete a 90-minute trial shift to ensure it's a good fit. After the trial, compliance needs will begin and may take up to six weeks.
- As Needed Volunteers: Volunteers participating in one-time client and fundraising events do not need formal volunteer orientation or screening. Event volunteers will receive a general orientation to the agency and event-specific training and information. The agency will not keep individual files on as-needed volunteers.
- **Special Project Volunteers:** Volunteers who visit the agency for a short duration of time (i.e., a college group that visits for a week), will receive agency orientation and training appropriate to roles and responsibilities for their visit.
- CPA staff and clients who wish to volunteer must have the same training and screening requirements as others.

Volunteer Protocols & Compliance:

Many of our children have medical complications and are foster kids that require specific guidelines to be in place.

- Regular Volunteers (more than once a quarter) must go through DCFS and health information (background check, fingerprinting, and a TB test).
- Volunteers will follow Agency Policy, Council on Accreditation (COA), and are located HR 6
- Masks, proof of vaccination, and onsite temperature checks may also be required.

Policy:

Volunteer resources will be used appropriately and by agency needs. Volunteers are an extension of CPA staff resources and are welcome in various Children's Place Association functions. Volunteers do

not take the place of paid staff; they do, however, supplement and enhance programs with and under the supervision of paid staff.

Frequently Asked Questions

How much time is needed to volunteer?

Because we have a variety of volunteer opportunities, your time commitment will vary depending on how you choose to volunteer. Your level of commitment is up to you, and we are grateful for every effort you take on behalf of our organization and the children we serve!

What is the age requirement for volunteering at CPA?

The general age is 18 and over. Some specific programs may vary, so inquire about the specific role you are looking for.

Can I volunteer for community service hours?

Children's Place Association is unable to provide court-appointed service hours
